Halfmoon Township Park Programming Survey

Purpose

The purpose of this survey is to assess the needs and wants of Halfmoon Township residents related to future programming and events at Autumn Meadow Park. The information gleaned from this survey will be used to complement the proposed park development plan in future grant applications to finance the park improvements.

Respondent Demographics

- ➤ n=155
- > 64% female, 36% male
- Most between the ages of 51-60
- ▶ 97% live within 5 mi. of Autumn Meadow Park
- > 32% currently spend time at the park
 - ➤ Of these people, 11% visit the park >6 times a month
 - ➤ The majority of people (66%) visit the the park 1-2 times a month



Methods

- ➤ Web-based survey monkey, open for 3 weeks, distributed to residents via the township listserv
- ➤ Informal interviews with residents at Way Fruit Farm Fall Festival (pictured above in Figure 1)

Final Rankings of Park Programming Options

Program Type	Suggested Events or Activities
1. Local Food Events	Weekly or monthly farmers market or "local eats" event
2. Community Garage Sale	Use park as location to host all participants in one location
3. Music Events	Showcase local talents (youth and adults) with summer concert series, informal "jam" sessions
4. Youth Rec/ Sporting Events	Summer Field Day, youth Halloween parade
5. Fitness Programming	Fitness walking, jogging, or yoga groups
Other options include: 6.) Environmental Education 7.) Opportunities to shop 8.) Local Theater Production 9.) Art Shows	

Citizen Comments and Concerns

- Lots of enthusiasm about the proposed walking path & prospect of new events at the park
- Concerns stemming from crowd-control and parking issues while hosting large events
- Emphasis on keeping events local and "community-based"
- Most residents prefer events to be held on weekends (Friday-Sunday)
